Patient Instructions

Thermoplastic/ Dual Appliance Care



Prior to placing the appliance in your mouth:

- a. Brush and floss your teeth.
- b. Soften the appliance under warm tap water to aid in placement of the appliance over your teeth.



To insert the appliance:

- a. Use the forefinger and thumb of both hands to guide the appliance into place over your teeth.
- b. Gently close your teeth together to insure the appliance is fully seated.



Removal of the appliance:

- a. Use the forefinger and thumb of both hands to grasp the appliance.
- b. Pull the appliance from your teeth.



Cleaning the appliance:

- a. Use liquid hand soap or other mild toothpaste abrasive recommended by your dentist.
- b. Brush the appliance under cold tap water with a soft toothbrush.



Storage of your appliance:

- a. Shake moisture from the appliance.
- b. Place the appliance in the container provided by your dentist or use a sealable container to store your appliance.



Mineral deposits or opacity:

- a. Mineral deposits can accumulate causing discoloration. If this occurs, soak the appliance for approximately 15 minutes in a denture soak cleanser.
- b. After soaking, allow the appliance to air dry and store it in your sealable container.

Note: Air drying helps to dissipate the opaque appearance caused by excess moisture. Follow appointments as directed by your dentist.

Contact your dentist if:

- a. Changes in your symptoms occur, or,
- b. If changes occur in the appearance of your mouth or gums.
